

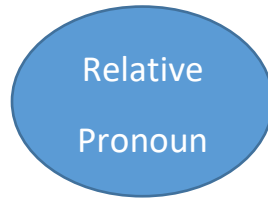

### Relative clause:

A relative clause is a type of subordinate clause that can be used to give extra information about a noun. It cannot stand alone.

A relative clause always begins with a relative pronoun.



who	that
which	where
whose	when

Here the relative clause (**in red**) is after the main clause.

James lives in Exeter **which is a cathedral city**.

I am cross with the cat **that scratched me on my arm**.

That's the girl **who lives near the school**.

The relative clause can also be added in the middle of the sentence. This is called an embedded clause.

My mum, **who is 64**, still goes to the gym every day.

The Titanic, **which was the largest ship at the time**, sank on her maiden voyage.
